



ANTIQUITIES

THE KHANDU BUG

One of the frustrations that I have been met with in collecting is the separation of items, boxes, and instructions that come in and the Khandu Bug remained a frustration for a couple of years. I would come across the box but had no hope of finding the instructions, or find the gimmicks and now couldn't locate the box. Finally it all came together so I can present to you an early, intelligent, utility gimmick.



I have come across ads for the Khandu Bug in early periodicals (c1920s) and there were actually patents applied for. At the right of the photograph you will notice a long metal stick, that was the included "screwdriver". The left of the photo is the gimmick. This could be used as a pull or hook vanisher and could vanish anything that could be gripped at the mouth of the device (of which the jaws were adjustable) which were generally card(s) or a coin.

The top of the device opposite the jaws contained a screw which could be removed and elastic for a pull could be attached. At the top of one of the jaws was a set screw which adjusted the jaw spacing. Attached to the screw at the top was a hook which could be attached to handkerchiefs or clothing to so a coin, etc. could be held out (hidden) after a vanish or before producing. In the photo the Khandu looks large but in fact it is a tiny device at only about a 1/2" long and maybe an 1/8" wide. This intelligent utility gimmick was made by the Khandu Co. of St. Louis. MO
