## WHATSIT?



# Here's a clever electronic gadget that hasn't been seen for $\mathbf{1 5}$ or 20 years. 

A very early example of a mini-computer (invented by Harry Potter's great-great-great Grandfather Benjamin Franklin Potter) finds a freely selected card not once, but TWICE!

This little beauty will produce an audible "beep" and the red lights will flash when the button at the lower center of the assembly is pushed.

In performance, the button is pushed and the mini-computer (remember this was made a long time ago) flashes/beeps several combinations to indicate the position and name of two randomly selected playing cards. The kicker finale' is when the chosen card vanishes from the deck and appears inside the closed card box.

## THE SAME...ONLY DIFFERENT II

Welcome to a continuation of last month's voyage through The Accumulation pausing every now and then to look at apparatus that produces the same effect, but has a different (albeit sometimes slightly different) secret mechanism or construction.


First up is a classic effect as manufactured by P \& L and known as the Phantom Die. A solid ungimmicked $21 / 2$ inch die is shown and a small open-sided metal framework. The die will fit into the framework and the framework rests upon a little ungimmicked platform to isolate the entire assembly from the Magician's table. An empty top hat is set crown downwards covering the empty platform. The die inside the framework is covered with a foulard (how long has it been since you've used THAT term?) and set upon the bottom of the inverted top hat. You can see the die above the top hat until the final moment. A Magic Word is spoken. The audience sees the die is now missing from the framework, having penetrated the top hat and found resting upon the platform that was underneath the top hat.

The attractive wooden set on the right is Mel Babcock's IMPROVED version. All parts of this beautiful example of Mel's woodworking may be examined during the course of the trick. It's the same trick improved and made first class all the way!


Next is a Worth's (not Milson-Worth) Silk Cabby. The original Worth models and most others in The Accumulation have the standard "elevator" load chamber construction (refer to Rice \#2), not the improved non-stick pivot mechanism as do the later Milson-Worth versions. To the right is another approach to the Silk Cabby. I do not know the origin of this piece, but it has the look of an Indian or Japanese import. It is made well and the bottom is very thin due to the load being concealed on the back door. I remember making one of these out of a cigar box when I was just a little Magician!

Here's one of my very favorites in The Accumulation, Thayer's Rice and Checker Effect (later "Rice, Checkers and Orange'). This set is probably circa 1930's based upon the beatle design on the tubes. (An interesting side note: This effect was sold as an upgrade from Thayer's Here, There, or Where? apparatus which originally involved a bottle instead of the separate checkers.)
The effect is baffling and easy to follow: A stack of large wooden checkers is covered by one tube; an orange is covered by another tube and a bag of loose rice is poured into the attractive wooden vase.
The Magic Spell is cast (too much Harry Potter this week-end) and the rice has vanished from the
 vase and in it's place is the orange, the rice is found where the checkers were and the checkers are where the orange was!


The other set is U.F. Grant's/MAK Magic's Imperial Rice Checkers and Orange. In addition to being considerably larger than the Thayer set (although it should be noted Owens Magic Supreme also offers a giant version of Rice, Checkers and Orange), the typical ingenious Grant thinking in this larger set improved the ease of handling the cylinders and simplified the transformation of the loose rice into the solid orange.

I have pleasant thoughts about this apparatus because I first received an Owen's set with shiny chrome cylinders (not painted) and a metal vase as a birthday present in the early 1960's. I sold or traded that and in later years purchased an old Thayer or Owen's set from Sam Berland at a Collectors' week-end at Magic Inc. in the early 1970's. The wooden vase needed to be refinished and Chicago Magician Don Wiberg (who was also a shop teacher) did a beautiful job. At some point I sold or traded that set. (Is there a pattern developing here?). A few years ago I acquired the Thayer set pictured from our friend Jay Gorham. Just recently Gail surprised me with the Imperial set. Methinks these last two are keepers!

Many of his effects are sold in your local magic shops, but he makes them "better" by developing his own presentation!

Because Stephen normally does not give lectures anymore, we were most fortunate to coax him into appearing with us because he was in town to perform at Michael Finney's charity for children, the "All-Star Comedy and Variety Show". For me, the highlights of his show and lecture were the Silent Mental Card routine which he developed with Don Alan, and his "The Plunger Trick", ably assisted by members
Steve Peebles and John Thornton.

In our raffle, Stuart Friedman won four tickets to the Casino Arizona "Showstoppers", Larry
Wilfong won a copy of "Out of This
Hemisphere", and John Thornton won a bunch of bucks in the split-the pot! Hope to see you next month!
